

Catching a seal by Abbu



Agnes art gallery by Presley



So I made my polar bear attacking an igloo. Then we got to have a snack and leave on the bus ride back. It was fun!




Bear on an outrage by W.Akira McLaren






Using blubber to make fuel by Eh k lu April 6 2017

Nunavut By Ethan


The pic above is my drawing.



My story is about a man hunting seals that he needs for his own tribe, to survive which is one of the main sources, and another fact is they had used whale fat, warmth for lamps. The guy in the picture is representing the hunting importance for everyone in the clan. When the person waited for the seals to rise from the north, or the frozen water which is open and clear, so when the hunter got a chance to *spear the animal* he would kill it by throwing the spear into the animal's side or the head. Then the dogs would retrieve the seal from the water. Then they would skin the animal for the blubber fat and meat. After that they would do a ceremony for the animal's spirit because they respect all the animals they sacrifice, the animal would be given thanks for all the "stuff" they need.
